A Word from Rev. Dr. Jon Nelson:

If you were to ask me in February how long until Spring, I would have probably told you that I would expect it pretty soon. I thought it was going to be a short winter, but as March rolled in, it became obvious that my Spring plans would have to be put on hold. Although the calendar says it is spring, the weather doesn't always want to cooperate. It is the same way with life; we might want something to go our way, but life doesn't always cooperate. Perhaps we pray earnestly for a new job or the health of a loved one; and when it doesn't turn out the way we hoped, we can be left to wonder, "Is God really listening?"

We have become a consumer based culture where "the customer is always right," so when we pray for something, we expect to see results and see them quickly. However, God's will and timeline is often much different from ours. This doesn't mean that God doesn't care about our concerns. It just means that we need to hand over our concerns to God and let God work them out in his timeframe, not ours.

In other parts of the world, they don't seem to struggle with these issues of God's providence quite like we do. We have gotten so used to instant gratification that we have become impatient. In the days of the horse and buggy, going to the store was a several hour venture; it was something you planned for because you probably wouldn't get there again in a week. Now, when we need milk, we immediately jump in the car and drive to the local store.

For us as Americans, it can be exasperating waiting for God's provision. However, with that waiting comes patience and as Paul reminds us in his letter to the Galatians, patience is a gift of the Spirit. Sometimes, life doesn't work out the way we wanted. That is when we must trust that God has a better plan. It can be difficult when it concerns someone we love or something that we are anxious about. However, we must always remember that God's perspective is much broader than ours.

After Jesus was crucified, things didn't turn out the way the disciples had planned. They found themselves defeated and broken – lost without Jesus. God had a different plan than what they thought possible and hope sprung eternal on that first Easter morning. That hope didn't happen overnight. It took over a thousand years to develop from God's promise to Abraham to its fulfillment in Jesus Christ.

Our troubles can be very difficult and they can seem insurmountable, but they are not insurmountable to God. Just as the disciples learned, put your trust in God and He will bring you to a new understanding of what's possible. During Covid, we learned to be more patient because we had to be, but now, if you are like me, we find ourselves even more impatient than before the pandemic. We must each take a step back and recognize that we have collectively as a congregation, community, nation and world gone through a traumatic period. It will take us time to get back to feeling alright with delays. We need to be patient with ourselves and allow ourselves time to heal. God's spirit is still with us and He will carry us through.

So, as this California boy waits for spring, for the daffodils and the budding of trees, I will try to be more thankful for the many great gifts God has provided. I will leave the weather to God's provision instead of the calendar. Spring will get here, perhaps even by the time you read this article.



We wish the members of Plains Presbyterian Church a Happy and Blessed Easter. We are grateful for the support the members provide to Cranberry Nursery School.



Session Highlights February 2023

Session met on Monday, February 20, 2023. Below are some of the highlights of that meeting.

Communion was served on February 19, 2023 to 35 people.

Looking to paint classrooms this summer. Windows will be all be changed in the classrooms. Request to change the windows first, and then paint. Looking to ask parents for donations and the congregation.

Session reviewed the financial reports of the church. Our church financials are in good shape. We paid our full year per capita of \$3,346 (as we do every January).

Our 2023 collections for Per Capita thus far have totaled approximately \$1,400. While collecting our entire \$3,360 is an idealistic goal, we hope to receive approximately 65% of our assigned per capita each year. We are still short of this goal.

Session received the Treasurer's report by consensus.

Deacons met yesterday. Very busy with activities. Making cards for "Honor Flight" on March 12. Home Touch materials were sent to 25 people in February.

Rev. Dr. Nelson reviewed his written report. Training opportunity at CCUPC are available.

VBS July 17 through July 21. Stellar is the title for VBS this year. 6:30 to 8:30 pm. More information will be coming soon to the website.

Our contract with the North Pittsburgh Greeting Company is working and approximately 70 new people have been visited per month.

The safety deposit box was opened and not much was in it. We are going to keep it, update signature cards, and decide what records we put in the box.

Hosanna Industries was briefly discussed. Ron Carter will invite them to present at our next Session meeting.

Next Regular Session Meeting will be on Monday, March 20, 2023 at 7:00 pm with Rev. Dr. Jon Nelson moderating.

Motion to adjourn by Ron Carter, seconded by Erin McKinley. Rev. Dr. Jon closed with prayer at 8:20 p.m.
