Some people have their future all planned out; they know (or think they do) what they're going to be doing in the future near and far. It's not been all so long since I joined you, but you probably know by now that I'm not that kind of person. I have plans, but I won't be all so surprised if God laughs and ends up showing me a better way. Do you think that we're in similar situations?

I'm going and Pastor Jon is coming, and you folks are embarking on a journey—by staying right at Plains Presbyterian Church. Day by day you'll be going on that journey together, generally by choosing one good instead of another, but sometimes by turning away from a bad to God's good. Those are hard decisions, and, if you're at all like me, you might find them very hard to make. It might seem like you're that proverbial donkey in danger of starving because it can't choose one bale of hay over the other, though of course it never realizes that starvation might be the outcome of not choosing!

What to do when it seems so much easier to not choose, to stay the way you have always been (even though you haven't always been that way)? Listen to your leaders: the Session and Pastor Jon, of course, but also work hard at realizing what God has done for you and what you can do for God. For me, lately I've been thinking about a way that has helped me in the past to move from where I am to where I can find out where God is calling me to next. I've been thinking about the meaning and message of Christmas, and that has helped me in finding an invigorating outlook on my future.

What is the meaning of Christmas? A lot of people think Christmas is all about hope, the hope that comes as we focus on giving of ourselves to others. That is part of the meaning of Christmas, but I think that there is an even more powerful message, the message about what life was like before Christmas, both chronologically and personally. Christmas drives home the reality of our helplessness and our hopelessness apart from what God has done in Jesus. God loves us so very much that he sent his Son to be our Savior, to give up the glories of heaven and become fully human, from birth to death to resurrection and ascension, all for our salvation. If there were any other way; if we could be saved by any other means other than how Jesus saved us, then God would certainly have done it. But we were "without hope and without God in the world" (Eph. 2:12), so God gave us hope through Jesus Christ, despite the cost. That's love.

God in Christ saving us lets me remember that Christmas is more than a beautiful story of the birth of a baby. It is the *contrast* of Christmas that gives me hope in my life today. Christmas is the story of our helplessness and hopelessness confronted and overcome by the grace of Jesus, and as I remember that, I experience a bounce, a bounce from helplessness to a sure and certain hope in Jesus. Christmas reminds me that I could never save myself, so drastic measures were needed if I was to be saved. God undertook those measures through Jesus, and so I can freely face an uncertain tomorrow, because it's only uncertain to me, but not to God.

So, in this time of changing ministry, while we might feel like that donkey, uncertain which way to turn, we can know that there is help and hope for us who celebrate Christmas, the birth of our Savior. We can know that we are created new in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God has prepared in advance for us to do (Eph 2:12). If God has prepared them for us to do, then certainly God will provide us with a way to do them. I think that means that we can choose, one way or the other and be assured of finding God there, calling us forward to the upward way of Christ Jesus our Lord. I can *and so will you*, and so will we all, though not together, find those good things God has prepared for us to do.

I will be praying for you. Please keep me in your prayers.


