A Word from Rev. Dr. Jon Nelson:

Fourth of July is a time of celebration for our freedoms. Next year will be the thirty fifth anniversary of the Tiananmen Square massacre. This tragic event reminds us how blessed we are to live in the United States. We live in a great country which protects our freedom. It is tragic that many across the world don't possess the basic freedoms that we as Americans enjoy.

It is in our fundamental belief that "all men are created equal" that our country was founded upon. This belief was not first extolled by our Founding Fathers, but in the Christian faith in which they professed. For they knew the words that the Apostle Paul declared in his letter to the Galatians:

So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus; (Galatians 3:26-28) and it is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery. (Galatians 5:1)

Paul understood that whether it is the oppression forced upon a people by another nation or the oppression we place upon ourselves through our own sinfulness, that freedom requires a cost and it is not easily obtained. Paul knew that Jesus had paid the cost of our freedom upon the cross. Christ's act transformed everything for humankind. No longer where we under the yoke of sin, but we now live in the freedom of Christ.

And just as our freedom from sin required a sacrifice, so too did our individual liberties. Many who fought for our country's independence paid the price for our freedom with their sweat, tears, and lives. Having their freedom cast aside, these men and women understood the necessity of freedom for our nation and they were willing to pay the cost. Because of their sacrifice, we can enjoy and celebrate our liberty and freedom on the fourth of July.

As I look around the world and I see others under the yoke of oppression, I am saddened that humanity is a "stiff-necked" people. We tend not to learn from our mistakes. As I see Sunni's fighting Shiites or Israeli's against Palestinians, I think about all of our ancestors who came to America to flee religious persecution. America was a blank slate. It was place where people could come to worship freely from persecution and imprisonment. As Presbyterians, we believe that God is the Lord of the conscience and that every person has been given the right to follow God as he or she sees fit. We might not agree with others' beliefs but we don't have the right to force that belief upon them. We certainly don't threaten them with injury, imprisonment, or death. God respects our beliefs and therefore we believe that we should respect others and their beliefs. At the least we should have mutual forbearance toward one another.

However, until Christ returns, the sad reality is that people will continue to impose their will upon one another. And until Christ returns, we will live in an imperfect world. Our country is not perfect; we have our problems and myopias, but it is still the best country in the world in which to live. I thank God for our country and I thank God for our freedom from oppression and our freedom in Christ.

My prayer is that you will have a wonderful Fourth of July celebration with family and friends, and that we each will remember those who have made our freedom possible. Let us not take our freedom for granted because there are many in the world who don't have the freedoms we have been given. And let us remember to be tolerant of others with differing views than our own. Let us each be clothed in the freedom and love of Christ. And may God bless America with faith, hope, and love.


