# A Word from Rev. Dr. Jon Nelson:

For the most part, we have had a mild summer, but we know with Fall will come storms. The winds will blow. A drenching rain will fall loudly upon our rooftops. The biting cold will come. I am used to storms and rain having lived in Wisconsin and Seattle.

What about the storms in the Bible? There of course is Noah and the flood; also, Jonah was caught up in a storm and thrown overboard when he refused to follow God's call; and Jesus calmed the storm on the Sea of Galilee. There are many more references to what we would call the metaphorical storms of life: Job's loss of his family, Ruth and Naomi sent adrift after the death of their husbands, the betrayal of David's son Absolom, the mental illness of Saul...the list goes on and on.

One thing that I love about the Bible is it doesn't sugar coat the hardness of life. The Bible doesn't tell us that if we accept God, life will be easy; there still will be storms in our lives that we must endure. However, what God does promise is that through those storms, He will always be there to help us weather the storm.

I know that in my own life there have been storms, some of them of my own making and others not. In those times, I have been thankful that God was there to sustain and strengthen me. Sometimes I was strengthened through God's Word, other times through the fellowship of fellow Christians, and sometimes God's presence was revealed through prayer and reflection. Sometimes God's assurance came quickly and other times it took months before I realized that God had been with me the whole time.

Since I came here, many of you shared the storms that you are struggling with: Unemployment, death, cancer, and family difficulties to name a few. I feel honored that you trust me with these difficult and personal experiences and I have seen God at work in your faith and continued perseverance. Please continue to know that you are not alone and God cares about you and your struggle.

I have also seen God in the kindness of these two congregations as I have seen you extend a warm hug or a kind word to your fellow congregants as they deal with tough issues. In these simple acts, God is working mightily through you as you are Christ's disciple to that person. I give thanks and praise for the compassion and grace that is so evident in your lives.

Unfortunately, storms happen. It is a part of life that we will have to continue to endure until Christ returns. However, through the gifts of the Church, the grace of Christ, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, God has given us the resources we need to weather any storm. Praise be to God!

# <u>New Ministry Opportunity in Butler County</u>

The Isaiah 117 House project is designed to fill a gap in our foster care system. When Butler County Children & Youth Services determines that a child is in an unsafe situation, there can be a short-term gap (1-3 days) un til caseworkers can find suitable placement in a foster family. An Isaiah 117 House would serve this need and ease the trauma associated with this transition.

Every church in Butler County is invited to send representatives to a breakfast on Wednesday October 11<sup>th</sup> 9:00 AM to learn more. Volunteer meetings are held at 7:00 PM the first Thursday of each month at Community Alliance Church, 800 Mercer Road, Butler PA 16001. In addition to hands-on caring for children, volunteers are needed for: administrative work, cooking/baking, cleaning/housekeeping, home maintenance, lawn care, music, community engagement, monthly financial sponsorships (i.e., "sock buddies"), grant writing, and other tasks.
